From that time on Paul stopped punishing the Christians. He was baptized, and he went everywhere telling people about Jesus and helping them believe in him. Many people became followers of Jesus because Paul told them about him. The Church celebrates Saint Paul's feast on July 25th.

John Vianney John was from a family of farmers in France. As a young man he taught other children their prayers. But school was very hard for John. He was a slow learner he studied very heard to became a parish priest. He loved the people in his parish. John had a gift from God. He used his gift to help sinners who came to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. People would come many miles to celebrate the sacrament with him. Sometimes he would hear confessions all day long. He helped people know God's forgiving love.
